A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS it is provided by section 11 of the Medical Service Ordinance, Ch. 12. No. 1, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by proclamation, to divide such portions of the Colony as he may see fit into medical districts, and to abolish and reconstitute such districts, and to alter or change the boundaries thereof:

And whereas it is expedient to divide the Colony into medical districts:

Now, therefore, I, EDWARD BETHAM BEETHAM, Governor as aforesaid, do hereby proclaim the undermentioned areas to be medical districts within the meaning of the said Ordinance, that is to say:—

1. The area bounded as follows:—

WEST—The Maraval River from the Sea up to the Saddle Road;

NORTH—The Saddle Road from the Maraval River to the Queen's Park Savannah;

EAST —A line along the western and southern sides of the Queen's Park Savannah from the Saddle Road to Dundonald Street, thence along Dundonald Street and Richmond Street to Marine Square; thence in a due South direction to the Sea;

SOUTH—The Sea;

to be the western medical district of Port-of-Spain.

2. The area bounded as follows:—

WEST —A line along Richmond Street, from the junction of Park and Richmond Streets to Dundonald Street, then up Dundonald Street to the Savannah, thence along the southern and western sides of the Queen's Park Savannah to the Saddle Road, thence along the Saddle Road to the first crossing of the Maraval River; then along a line due North-east to the ridge forming the eastern watershed of the Maraval River; thence along that ridge to the point where it meets the ridge of hills running eastwards through St. Ann's Peak;

NORTH AND EAST—A line starting from the last mentioned point and running easterly along the ridge passing through St. Ann's Peak, then southerly along the ridge of the Laventille Hills to the Laventille Road;

SOUTH—The Laventille Road from the last mentioned point to the point where the eastern boundary of Port-of-Spain crosses the Laventille Road near the McShine Reservoir, thence by a line running in a westerly direction to Park Street Bridge over the Dry River, thence along Park Street to the junction of Park and Richmond Streets;

to be the North-eastern medical district of Port-of-Spain.

3. The area bounded as follows:—

EAST —The line forming the eastern boundary of Port-of-Spain, from the Sea to Picton Road, thence along Picton Road to the Laventille Road;

NORTH—The Laventille Road from its junction with the Picton Road to the point where the eastern boundary of Port-of-Spain crosses the first mentioned road near the McShine Reservoir, thence by a line in a westerly direction to Park Street Bridge over the Dry River, thence along Park Street to the junction of Park and Richmond Streets;

WEST —A line along Richmond Street from the last mentioned point to Marine Square, thence in a due South direction to the Sea;

SOUTH—The Sea;

to be the South-eastern medical district of Port-of-Spain.

4. The Ward of Montserrat to be the Gran Couva medical district.

5. The Ward of Couva to be the Couva medical district.

6. The Ward of Pointe-a-Pierre and so much of the Savana Grande Ward as lies to the North of a line starting at the point where the Naparima-Mayaro Road crosses the southern boundary of Gilmore Hill Estate and proceeding in an easterly direction along the southern boundaries of Gilmore Hill, Santa Margarita and Garth Estates, thence along the eastern boundary of the Garth Estate to the North-west corner of the Buen Intento Estate, thence along the northern boundaries of the Buen Intento and New Grant Estates and thence in the same straight line to the Sancho Road, thence along the Sancho Road to its junction with the Torrib-Tabaquite Road, to be the Guaracara medical district.

7. So much of Naparima Ward as lies to the North and East of a line from the Sea along the northern boundary of the Town of San Fernando, then along the eastern boundary of the Town of San Fernando, then from the junction of the southern and eastern boundaries of the Town of San Fernando in a straight line to the Ciperio Road, then along the Ciperio Road, excluding the villages of Victoria and St. John, to the eastern boundary of the Naparima Ward; and also that part of the Savana Grande Ward which lies to the South of a line starting at the point where the Naparima-Mayaro Road crosses the southern boundary of Gilmore Hill Estate and proceeding in an easterly direction along the southern boundaries of Gilmore Hill, Santa

Margarita and Garth Estates, thence along the eastern boundary of the Garth Estate to the North-west corner of the Buen Intento Estate, thence along the northern boundaries of the Buen Intento and New Grant Estates and thence in the same straight line to the Sancho Road, thence along the Sancho Road to its junction with the Torrib-Tabaquite Road, to be the Princes Town medical district.

8. Ortoire and Moruga Wards to be the Ortoire-Moruga medical district.

9. Cedros Ward to be the Cedros medical district.

10. The Counties of Nariva and Mayaro to be the Nariva-Mayaro medical district.

11. The area bounded as follows:—

NORTH—From the Sea along the northern boundary of the Borough of San Fernando, then along the eastern boundary of the said Borough of San Fernando, then a straight line from the junction of the southern and eastern boundaries of San Fernando to the Ciperó Road, then along the Ciperó Road including the villages of Victoria and St. John;

SOUTH—Southern boundary of Naparima Ward;

EAST —Eastern boundary of Naparima Ward;

WEST —Western boundary of Naparima Ward; to be the South Naparima medical district.

12. The area bounded as follows:—

Starting at a point where the Godineau River and the St. John Canal meet, thence in an easterly direction along the boundary of the County of St. Patrick which follows the south bank of the Godineau River to and along the eastern boundary of the County of St. Patrick to the Sea (Negra Point) thence in a westerly direction along the Sea coast to the western boundary of the Ward of Siparia continuing in a northerly and westerly direction along the western boundary of the said Ward, across the San Fernando-Siparia-Erin Road and along the Ward Boundary to the point where it meets the John River, thence along the right bank of this River to and along the Rio Negro to and along the St. John Canal to the point where it meets the Godineau River; to be the Siparia medical district.

13. The area bounded as follows:—

Starting at a point where the Guapo River enters the Sea and continuing in an easterly direction along the Sea coast to the point where the Godineau River enters the Sea, thence in a south-easterly direction along the said River to the point where it meets the St. John Canal, thence along this Canal in a southerly direction to the Rio Negro, to and along the left bank of the John River to the point where it meets the northern boundary of the Ward of Erin, thence continuing in a westerly direction along the boundary of the said Ward to the point where it meets Grande Ravine thence along the said Ravine to and along the right bank of the Guapo River to the Sea; to be the La Brea medical district.

14. The area bounded as follows :—

From the point where the Guapo River enters the Sea— along the left bank of this River to the Grande Ravine, along the said Ravine to the point where it meets the northern boundary of the Erin Ward, thence in an easterly and southerly direction along the northern and eastern boundary of the said Ward to the Sea, thence in a westerly direction along the Sea coast to the western boundary of Erin Ward, thence along the western boundary of the said Ward to the Erin Road, thence in a northerly direction along the eastern side of the said Road to the Sea, thence in an easterly direction along the Coast to the point of commencement;

to be the Point Fortin medical district.

Where a boundary runs along a road or ridge or river, the boundary shall be deemed to be a line along the middle of such road, ridge or river.

DELEGATION OF POWERS AND DUTIES

(The Muslim Marriage and Divorce Registration Ordinance, Ch. 29. No. 4)
