A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS it is provided by section 11 of the Medical Service Ordinance, Ch. 12. No. 1, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by proclamation, to divide such portions of the Colony as he may see fit into medical districts, and to abolish and reconstitute such districts, and to alter or change the boundaries thereof:

And whereas it is expedient to alter the boundaries of the Siparia, Point Fortin and La Brea medical districts:

Now, therefore, I, SOLOMON HOCHOY, Governor's Deputy as aforesaid, do hereby proclaim that the said medical districts shall be as follows:—

1. The area bounded as follows:—

Starting at a point where the Godineau River and the St. John Canal meet, thence in an easterly direction along the boundary of the County of St. Patrick which follows the south bank of the Godineau River to and along the eastern boundary of the County of St. Patrick to the sea (Negra Point) thence in a westerly direction along the sea coast to a point immediately south of the 22nd mile-mark on the main Palo Seco-Erin Road to the northern boundary of the Erin Ward and along the Ward Boundary to the point where it meets the John River, thence along the right bank of this River to and along the Rio Negro to and along the St. John Canal to the point where it meets the Godineau River;

to be the Siparia medical district.

2. The area bounded as follows:—

Starting at a point where the Vance River Road meets the sea and continuing in an easterly direction along the sea coast to the point where the Godineau River enters the sea, thence in a south-easterly direction along the said river to the point where it meets the St. John Canal, thence along this Canal in a southerly direction to the Rio Negro, to and along the left bank of the John River to the point where it meets the northern boundary of the Ward of Erin, thence continuing in a westerly direction along the boundary of the said Ward to the point where it meets Grande Ravine thence northwards to the Kern Trinidad Oilfields private road and along this and the Vance River Road to the sea;

to be the La Brea medical district.

3. The area bounded as follows:—

From the point where the Vance River Road meets the sea along this road and the Kern Trinidad Oilfields private road to the Grande Ravine, along the said Ravine to the point where it meets the northern boundary of the Erin Ward, thence in a southerly direction to the 22nd mile-mark on the main Palo Seco-Erin Road and thence to the sea, thence in a westerly direction along the sea coast to the western boundary of Erin Ward, thence along the western boundary of the said Ward to the Erin Road, thence in a northerly direction along the eastern side of the said road to the sea, thence in an easterly direction along the coast to the point of commencement; to be the Point Fortin medical district.

Where a boundary runs along a road or ridge or river, the boundary shall be deemed to be a line along the middle of such road, ridge or river.
