

GOVERNMENT NOTICE No. 73

TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

THE COLONIAL PRISON SERVICE MEDAL REGULATIONS, 1957

MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF THE ROYAL WARRANT
DATED THE 28TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1955

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Colonial Prison Service Medal ^{Short title.} Regulations, 1957.

2. (1) The Colonial Prison Service Medal will be granted as a reward for ^{Service} long service and good conduct to the following staff in the Prison Service of ^{required.} Trinidad and Tobago:—

- Grade I Officer (Chief Officer)
- Grade II Officer (Principal Officer)
- Grade III Officer
- Welfare Officer
- Chief Female Officer
- Female Officer
- Mechanic
- Transport Officer and Mechanic.

who on or after the 28th day of October, 1955, shall, subject to the provisions of these Regulations, have completed eighteen years' qualifying service.

(2) A Clasp will also be granted to the recipient of the Medal on the completion of twenty-five years' qualifying service and a further Clasp on completing thirty years' qualifying service. For each Clasp so awarded a small silver rose may be added to the ribbon when worn alone.

3. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Regulation, service shall only be reckoned as qualifying service if it is continuous. ^{Continuity of service.}

(2) Service in the Prison Service of other Colonies or Territories under Her Majesty's Protection or Administration may be allowed to reckon towards the required period of qualifying service.

(3) A break in service not exceeding six calendar months in any one territory shall not be regarded as breaking the continuity of such service.

(4) Where service has been rendered in more than one territory, an interval not exceeding twelve months between periods of service in any two territories shall not be regarded as breaking the continuity of such service.

4. (1) For the purpose of these Regulations, service shall only be reckoned as qualifying service if it is certified that the character and conduct of the person recommended for the grant of the Medal or Clasp has been exemplary. ^{Exemplary character.}

(2) In certifying under this Regulation that the character and conduct of a person has been exemplary, regard shall be had to the conduct and character of such person throughout his service and to the number and nature of the offences previously recorded in his conduct sheet:

Provided that no such certificate shall be given if the conduct sheet of such person discloses that during the ten years previous to the submission of his name there has been an adverse record.

Recommending authority.

5. Recommendations for the award of the Medal or Clasp shall be submitted by the Officer in charge of the Prison Service to the Governor or Officer Administering the Government. The Medal will be awarded on the authority of the Governor or Officer Administering the Government and a notification of such award shall be published in the *Royal Gazette*.

Forfeiture and restoration.

6. (1) A recipient of the Medal or Clasp who is convicted of a criminal offence or is dismissed or removed from the Prison Service for misconduct shall forfeit the Medal and Clasp unless the Governor or Officer Administering the Government shall otherwise direct.

(2) A Medal or Clasp so forfeited may be restored to the recipient by the Governor or Officer Administering the Government at his discretion.

(3) A notice of forfeiture or restoration shall in every case be published in the *Royal Gazette*.

Replacement.

7. In the event of the loss of the Medal or Clasp, it may be replaced on the recommendation of the Officer in Charge of the Prison Service at the expense of the holder, unless it is decided to relieve him of his liability.
