AN ACT to provide for the Supplementary Appropriation
for the service of Trinidad and Tobago for the year
ending on the 31st day of December, 1976.

[Assented to 18th June, 1976]

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, Enactment
by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and
House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago, and
by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Supplementary Short title
Appropriation (No. 3) Act, 1976.

Further issue of three hundred and fifty-two million, seven hundred and seventy-five thousand four hundred and ninety-nine dollars from the Consolidated Fund authorised

2. A further issue from the Consolidated Fund of the sum of three hundred and fifty-two million, seven hundred and seventy-five thousand, four hundred and ninety-nine dollars is hereby authorised for meeting expenditure for the service of the year ending 31st December, 1976, under the Heads of Expenditure specified in the Schedule; and the sum specified in the said Schedule opposite a Head is hereby appropriated out of the said three hundred and fifty-two million, seven hundred and seventy-five thousand, four hundred and ninety-nine dollars for the purposes specified in relation to that Head in the Supplementary Estimates for 1976.
