**E**NACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the  
advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

Short title

No. 33 of 1942

**1.** This Ordinance may be cited as the Solicitors (Amend-  
ment) Ordinance, 1951, and shall be read as one with the  
Solicitors Ordinance, 1942, hereinafter referred to as the  
Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 33 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended :—

- (a) by deleting therefrom the words "subject to their certificates being duly stamped in accordance with the provisions of the Stamp Duty Ordinance".
- (b) by deleting therefrom the words "and duly stamped" occurring in the second paragraph thereof.

3. Section 34 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended :—

- (a) by adding the following subsection immediately after subsection (1) thereof :—
  - (1A) "The Registrar may withhold the issue of a practising certificate to a solicitor until the annual subscription payable to the society has been paid".
- (b) by substituting the expression "Before a practising certificate is issued to a solicitor, he" for the expression "On the issue of a practising certificate to a Solicitor, the Accountant-General from moneys to be provided by the Legislative Council" occurring in paragraph (a) of subsection (4).
- (c) by deleting from paragraph (a) of subsection (4) the expression "The annual subscription to the Society shall not without the leave of the Governor in Council be greater than Five Dollars."
- (d) by deleting the second sub-paragraph of paragraph (b) of subsection (4).

4. Section 35 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting therefrom the words "duly stamped".
