AN ORDINANCE to amend "The Quarantine (amendment) Ordinance, 1894." (32—1894.)

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may (for all purposes be cited as short title. "The Quarantine (amendment) Ordinance, 1895.")

This Ordinance shall be read and construed as one Construction. with "The Quarantine (amendment) Ordinance, 1894."

2. Section 4 of "The Quarantine (amendment) Repeal Ordinance, 1894," is hereby repealed.

Incubation
period of
Cholera and
Yellow Fever.

For the purposes of the Principal Ordinance and this Ordinance the incubation period of Cholera shall be deemed to be six days and that of Yellow Fever ten days.

Repeal.

3. Section 7 of "The Quarantine (amendment) Ordinance, 1894," is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof shall be read the following:—

"7. The Quarantine Authority in Trinidad or Tobago, as the case requires, may, with the approval and consent of the Governor and Executive Council from time to time make, alter or revoke such Rules or Regulations not inconsistent with the provisions of the Principal Ordinance and this Ordinance as may be deemed necessary for the regulation of Quarantine between Trinidad and Tobago."

Passed in Council this Eighteenth day of February, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five.
