AN ORDINANCE relating to the sale of fresh meat and fresh fish in Princes Town.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Princes Town Short Title.
(Sale of fresh meat and fish) Ordinance, 1913.

2. In this Ordinance "Fresh meat" means fresh meat Interpretation.
of any cattle, sheep, goat, pig or turtle slaughtered for sale and includes imported fresh meat.

3. From and after the commencement of this Ordinance it shall not be lawful to sell or offer or expose for sale fresh meat or fresh fish within the limits of Princes Town as defined in and by Ordinance No. 177 except in the market established in Princes Town under the Country Markets Ordinance 1905 (No. 30.) Sale of fresh meat and fish prohibited except in market.

Penalty.

4. Any person who shall act in contravention of the provisions of Section 3 hereof may be arrested without warrant by any member of the Constabulary Force, and on summary conviction before any Magistrate shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds and in default of payment to imprisonment with or without hard labour for any term not exceeding one month.
