AN ORDINANCE to authorize the construction of the San Fernando-Siparia Railway.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short Title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the San Fernando-Siparia Railway Ordinance, 1912.

Construction of Railway.

2. It shall be lawful for the Governor to construct a Railway in the Ward of Naparima, to be known as the San Fernando-Siparia Railway, commencing at a point on the San Fernando Extension Railway authorised by Ordinance No. 12 of 1879, 250 feet or thereabout, measured in a South-westerly direction from the South-western corner of the San Fernando Station building, passing thence in a Southerly direction across Wharf lands vested in the Mayor and Burgesses of San Fernando by the Municipal Corporations Ordinance No. 210, and along the foreshore below high water mark to a point where the lands formerly of the Paradise Plantation, abut thereon; thence

across such lands to a junction with the San Fernando Tramroad authorised by Ordinance No. 10 of 1864, thence along that Tramroad to its junction with the Ciperro Tramroad authorised by Ordinance No. 4 of 1856, thence along the Ciperro Tramroad and such deviations therefrom as are delineated on the plan of the said Railway, to a point where such Tramroad passes through the lands of the Corinth plantation, thence in a South-easterly direction through lands of the Corinth and Golconda plantations, to a junction with the Siparia Railway authorised by Ordinance No. 6 of 1912 at the commencement thereof, according to the plan of such Railway made by Horace Richard Marwood, dated the 15th of June, 1912, and signed by Samuel William Knaggs, Colonial Secretary, and the said Horace Richard Marwood, Chief Resident Engineer of the Trinidad Government Railway, and deposited in the Office of the Sub-Intendant of Crown Lands.

Passed in Council this Seventeenth day of June, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twelve.
