AN ORDINANCE further relating to the manufacture of
Bay rum and Perfumed spirits.

[11th November, 1931.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Spirits and Spirit Short title.
Compounds (Amendment No. 2) Ordinance, 1931, and shall
be read as one with the Spirits and Spirit Compounds Construction.
Ordinance, Cap. 198.

2. The Spirits and Spirit Compounds (Amendment) Amendment of
Ordinance, 1931, is hereby amended as follows :— s. 3 of Ord. 24
of 1931.

(a) By renumbering section 3 thereof as section 3(1) and
by adding thereto the following proviso and sub-section :—

Provided that it shall be lawful for any
licensed compounder to whom such permission
has been given, to add to any such rum or other
spirits bay oil and/or any denaturant approved
by the Collector, in a public warehouse, in such
proportions as the proper officer of Customs and
Excise shall require, and thereupon, after pay-
ment of duty at the rate set out in section 4 of
this Ordinance, any such compounder may
remove such rum or other spirits to his licensed

premises, there to complete the process of manufacture of the bay rum or perfumed spirits. Provided also that no compounder who holds a licence to sell spirits by retail on the same premises shall be permitted to manufacture bay rum or perfumed spirits under this Ordinance on the said premises.

(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of any law to the contrary, it shall be lawful for any person to sell, without licence, in quantities not exceeding one liquid gallon at one time to one person, bay rum or perfumed spirits manufactured under this Ordinance.

(b) By repealing section 5 thereof and substituting the following :—

5. No person shall sell, or keep or expose for sale, or attempt to sell, any bay rum or perfumed spirits, whether imported or manufactured in the Colony, unless such bay rum or perfumed spirits conforms to such standards as the Governor may from time to time prescribe by notice in the *Royal Gazette*. Any person who contravenes the provisions of this section shall incur a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds.

(c) By repealing section 7 thereof, and substituting the following :—

7. Bay rum or perfumed spirits manufactured under this Ordinance may, subject to such conditions as the Collector may prescribe, be warehoused for exportation only, and it shall be lawful for the Collector thereupon to refund any duties paid upon rum or other spirits contained in any bay rum or perfumed spirits so warehoused. All such bay rum or perfumed spirits, upon being so warehoused, shall be subject to the Customs laws, so far as the same are applicable, in like manner as if they were goods subject to duties of Customs warehoused for exportation.
