AN ORDINANCE relating to the appointment, powers and duties of the Surveyor-General and the Deputy Surveyor-General.

[1st October, 1930.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Surveyor-General's Short Title Ordinance, 1930.
2. It shall be lawful for the Governor, with the approval Appointment of Surveyor-General. of the Secretary of State, to appoint a fit and proper person to be Surveyor-General of the Colony.
3. Wherever in any Ordinance, Order in Council, Regulation, Rule, Bye-law, Proclamation or document any power, right, duty or liability is conferred or imposed on the Crown Surveyor, such power, right, duty or liability shall from and after the commencement of this Ordinance be deemed to be conferred or imposed upon the Surveyor-General, and in every such Ordinance, Order in Council, Regulation, Rule, Bye-law, Proclamation or document references to the Crown Surveyor shall be read as references to the Surveyor-General. Transfer of powers and duties of Crown Surveyor to Surveyor-General.

4. It shall be lawful for the Governor, with the approval of the Secretary of State, to appoint a fit and proper person to be Deputy Surveyor-General.

5. Whenever, by any law for the time being in force in the Colony, anything is appointed to be done by the Surveyor-General, the same may be lawfully and for all purposes effectually done by the Deputy Surveyor-General.

Retrospective  
operation.

6. This Ordinance shall operate retrospectively and shall be deemed to have commenced on the first day of October, 1930.
