AN ORDINANCE to provide for the control of the sale
of ammunition.

[By Proclamation.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Sale of Short title.
ammunition Ordinance, 1921.

2. In this Ordinance the expression "ammunition" means Interpretation.
gunpowder, bullets, shot, cartridges, or any article used in
the discharge of firearms.

3.—(1.) No ammunition shall be sold by retail to any Restrictions
person unless at the time of sale such person produces a on sale of
licence to keep firearms then in force, or gives ammunition.

proof that he is a person entitled to keep firearms without a licence, and unless he also produces and delivers to the seller a permit in the form in the schedule to this Ordinance signed by an Officer of Constabulary not below the rank of Sub-Inspector authorising the purchase of such ammunition and specifying the quantity and description thereof.

Provided that the production of a licence shall not be required where the permit to purchase is endorsed by the officer granting the same authorising the sale without the production of a licence.

(2.) Every person who sells by retail any ammunition shall, before delivery, make or cause to be made an entry in a book to be kept for that purpose specifying the quantity and description of the ammunition sold, the date of such sale, the name and address of the purchaser, the person by whom and the place at which the licence produced by the purchaser was issued, the number and date of such licence, or the circumstances exempting such purchaser from having such licence. Such book shall be produced for inspection on the request of any member of the Constabulary Force, and the permit referred to in sub-section (1) hereof shall be delivered up to such officer.

(3.) Any person who contravenes any of the foregoing provisions of this section, or on the sale or purchase of any ammunition knowingly makes, or causes to be made, any false entry or statement as to any matter concerning which he is required by this section to make any entry or statement, shall be liable on summary conviction before a magistrate to a fine not exceeding ten pounds.

Nothing in this section contained shall make it an offence to sell and deliver ammunition to anyone representing himself to be the agent or servant of a person holding a licence or entitled to keep firearms without a licence if at the time such agent or servant produces a written authority from his employer to purchase such ammunition on his behalf.

Power to prohibit sale or to order delivery of ammunition.

4. The powers conferred on the Governor by sections 19 and 20 of the Firearms Ordinance, 1909, by proclamation to prohibit the sale of firearms and to order the delivery up of firearms may in like manner be exercised from time to time with regard to ammunition.
