

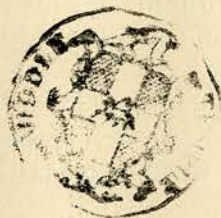

AN ORDINANCE to amend the Solicitors Ordinances.

[On Proclamation.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the Solicitors' Short Title and interpretation.
(Amendment) Ordinance, 1917.

(2.) In this Ordinance "the Principal Ordinance" means the Solicitors' Ordinance, 1912.

2. Section 8 of the Principal Ordinance (which is set Amendment of Section 8 of the Principal Ordinance.
forth in Section 5 of the Solicitors' Ordinance, 1914) is amended in the following respects:—

- (a.) By striking out in paragraph (6) thereof the words "Queen's College, Belfast"; and
- (b.) By adding at the end of paragraph (8) thereof the words "or the second General Knowledge examination under the Law Agents (Scotland) Act, 1873."



Repeal of
Sections 22, 23

3. Sections 22 and 23 of the principal Ordinance and the words "or touching the honesty and integrity or the professional conduct of Solicitors" in paragraph (6) of Section 36 of the said Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Charges
against
Solicitors and
Clerks.

4.—(1.) Any charge touching the honesty, integrity or financial status or touching the professional conduct of any Solicitor or Articled Clerk may be brought by the Society or the Registrar or any other person by way of petition to the Court.

(2.) The Chief Justice, with the concurrence of a Puisne Judge, may make rules prescribing the practice and procedure to be adopted in respect of any such petitions.

Commence-
ment.

5. This Ordinance shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by the Governor in Executive Council by Proclamation in the *Royal Gazette*.

Passed in Council this Seventh day of December in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventeen.
