AN ORDINANCE to amend the Sale of Ammunition Ordinance, Cap. 271.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Sale of Ammunition (Amendment) Ordinance, 1933, and shall be read as one with the Sale of Ammunition Ordinance, Cap. 271, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and shall come into operation on the date of publication in the *Royal Gazette*. Short title. Construction. Commencement.

2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and in lieu thereof shall be read the following :— Repeal and re-enactment of s. 2 of Principal Ordinance.

"2. In this Ordinance the expression "Ammunition" means bullets, shots, cartridges or any article used in the discharge of a rifle or pistol as defined by the Firearms Ordinance, Cap. 259,

but does not include gunpowder, cartridges, percussion caps, small shot or other articles used in the discharge of smooth bored guns. Provided that the Governor in Executive Council may by Proclamation extend the definition of ammunition herein contained to include any description of ammunition used in the discharge of any firearms."

Passed in Council this fourth day of November, in the year of Our Lord onethousandnine hundred and thirty-three.
