AN ORDINANCE to amend the Summary Conviction
Offences (Procedure) Ordinance, Cap. 24.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Summary Conviction Offences (Procedure) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1933, shall be construed as one with the Summary Conviction Offences (Procedure) Ordinance, Cap. 24, hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance, and shall come into operation on the date of publication in the *Royal Gazette*.

2. Section 85 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof shall be read the following:—

85.—(1) Where any person against whom is issued a warrant of commitment for non-payment of any sum of money adjudged to be paid by an order is arrested within the Magisterial District in which

the order was made by the constable having the execution of the warrant and such person offers to pay forthwith the sum or sums in such warrant mentioned, together with the amount of the expenses of such warrant up to the time of payment, such person shall be conveyed to the office of the Clerk of the Court of such District as soon as conveniently may be after his arrest, but not later than 48 hours after the arrest, and upon payment of such sum or sums and expenses to the Clerk of the Court, such person shall be forthwith liberated.

(2) If the office of the Clerk of the Court will not be opened for public business within the said period of 48 hours from the arrest, or if the person arrested fails to pay all sums and expenses as aforesaid to the Clerk of the Court in the manner provided for herein, he shall then be conveyed to the Royal Gaol as directed by the warrant.

(3) When the arrest is effected outside the Magisterial District in which the order was made, the person arrested shall be conveyed as soon as conveniently may be thereafter to the Royal Gaol as directed by the warrant.
