AN ORDINANCE to amend the Explosives
Ordinance, 1907.

[*14th* December, 1924.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative
Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Explosives Short title.
(Amendment) Ordinance, 1924, and shall be read as one (15-1907.)
with the Explosives Ordinance, 1907, hereinafter called
the Principal Ordinance.

2. The following shall be inserted as section 38A of the Inspection of
stock and
books.
Principal Ordinance:—

38A.—(1) It shall be lawful for any member of the
Constabulary Force, at any time when such
premises are open for business, to enter the

premises of any wholesale or retail dealer and to inspect all explosives in the stock of such dealer and the receptacles in which the same may be stored, and also to inspect the books kept by any such dealer under this Ordinance, and to take a copy of any entries in any of such books. Any such dealer who refuses to allow such inspection to be made or copy to be taken, or obstructs any member of the Constabulary Force while making such inspection or taking such copy, shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty-five pounds.

(2) Any wholesale or retail dealer whose stock of explosives does not correspond with the amount as shown by the entries in the books kept by such dealer under this Ordinance shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty-five pounds.

3. The Explosives (Amendment) Ordinance, 1908, is hereby repealed.
