

licence shall not be required for the importation of safety cartridges.

(2) Subject to the provisions contained in this part, the provisions of Part I of this Ordinance as to the importation, sale and removal of gunpowder shall *mutatis mutandis* apply to every other explosive except safety cartridges.

(3) Any person contravening the provisions of this section or the conditions of a licence issued hereunder shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding two hundred and forty dollars.

4. Sub-section (1) of Section 36 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and replaced by the following:—

(1) It shall be lawful for the Governor to provide a magazine in which any description of explosive may be stored, and every person importing or keeping any explosive under a licence issued under this part of this Ordinance shall store such explosive either in the Government magazine or in a building or place approved by the Governor.

5. The following section to be numbered 52 shall be added to and form part of the Principal Ordinance:—

52. If at any time in the opinion of the Governor in Executive Council an emergency has arisen in which it is expedient for the safety of the public peace that His Majesty's Government should have control over the possession, sale, disposal or use of any explosive the Governor in Executive Council may, during the continuance of such emergency, make such Orders as may appear desirable with respect to such possession, sale, disposal, or use of any explosive and may order any explosive to be delivered up on demand to such person or persons as the Governor may appoint.
