ORDER

MADE BY THE COMMISSIONER OF POLICE UNDER SECTION 68(1) OF THE
MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC ACT

THE TRAFFIC RESTRICTION (TEMPORARY PROVISIONS)
(CEREMONIAL OPENING OF PARLIAMENT) ORDER, 2005

1. This Order may be cited as the Traffic Restriction (Temporary Provisions) (Ceremonial Opening of Parliament) Order, 2005.

2. This Order has effect from 7.00 a.m. to 1.30 p.m. on Monday, 26th September, 2005.

3. A driver of a vehicle approaching the Red House for the Ceremonial Opening of Parliament shall do so by way of St. Vincent Street, Knox Street, Frederick Street, Hart Street and Abercromby Street.

4. (1) Vehicular traffic is prohibited from 9.00 a.m. to 1.30 p.m. on—
(a) Abercromby Street, between Queen Street and Duke Street;

(b) Knox Street;

(c) Hart Street;

(d) St. Vincent Street, between Duke Street and Queen Street;
and

(e) Pembroke Street, between Duke Street and Knox Street.

(2) Sub-clause (1) shall not apply to a vehicle—

(a) of the President of the Senate;

(b) of Ministers of Government; and

(c) bearing green, yellow, brown and red windscreen labels.

5. Subject to clause 7, parking is prohibited on the following roads from 7.00 a.m. to 1.30 p.m:

(a) Chancery Lane;

(b) Sackville Street, between Richmond Street and St. Vincent Street;

- (c) Hart Street;
- (d) Abercromby Street, between Queen Street and Keate Street;
- (e) Keate Street, between Charlotte Street and Frederick Street;
- (f) Frederick Street, between Keate Street and Hart Street;
- (g) Gordon Street, between Chancery Lane and Abercromby Street;
- (h) Knox Street, between St. Vincent Street and Frederick Street;
- (i) St. Vincent Street, between Duke Street and Queen Street;
- (j) Pembroke Street, between Knox Street and Duke Street; and
- (k) Edward Street, between Queen Street and Duke Street.

Parking reserved

6. (1) The following persons whose vehicles bear a brown windscreen label may park their vehicles on Knox Street, between Abercromby Street and Frederick Street:

- (a) Members of the Diplomatic Corps;
- (b) Heads of Religious Denominations; and
- (c) Judges of the Supreme Court.

(2) The Following persons whose vehicles bear a red windscreen label, may park their vehicles on Knox Street, between Abercromby Street and Frederick Street:

- (a) President of the Senate;
- (b) Speaker of the House; and
- (c) Government Ministers.

(3) A Member of Parliament other than a Minister of Government for whom parking is reserved under subclause (2)(c), and whose vehicle bears a yellow windscreen label may park his vehicle on Hart Street, between Frederick Street and Abercromby Street; Abercromby Street, between Queen Street and Hart Street and Pembroke Street, between Knox Street and Duke Street.

(4) A Driver of a vehicle bearing a green windscreen label and who is a guest attending the Ceremonial Opening of Parliament may park his vehicle on Hart Street between Frederick Street and Abercromby Street; Abercromby Street, between Queen Street and Hart Street and Pembroke Street, between Knox Street and Duke Street.

(5) A driver of a vehicle of the Trinidad and Tobago Regiment may park the vehicle on Edward Street, between Queen Street and Sackville Street.

(6) A driver of a vehicle of the Trinidad and Tobago Police Service may park the vehicle on Edward Street, between Sackville Street and Duke Street.

7. A driver of a taxi who normally plies the taxi for hire on— Taxi stand

(a) the St. Ann's route, from the taxi stand on Hart Street, shall operate from the southern side of Queen Street, between Frederick Street and Abercromby Street; and

(b) the St. James route, from the taxi stand on Hart Street, shall operate from the western side of Henry Street, between Prince Street and Duke Street.

8. Without prejudice to any other liability incurred by the commission of a summary offence, vehicles found parked in contravention of this Order may be removed by the Police and impounded and dealt with in accordance with section 108(1)(b) of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Act.
