ORDER

MADE BY THE MINISTER OF LEGAL AFFAIRS AFTER CONSULTATION WITH THE CHIEF JUSTICE UNDER SECTION 15A OF THE LEGAL PROFESSION ACT

THE LEGAL PROFESSION (ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION) (NO. 2) ORDER, 1996

1. This Order may be cited as the Legal Profession (Eligibility for Admission) (No. 2) Order, 1996.

2. The person referred to in Part I of the Schedule being a citizen of the United Kingdom qualified to practise law in the United Kingdom for not less than ten years, is eligible to be admitted to practise law in Trinidad and Tobago subject to the terms and conditions specified in Part II of the Schedule:

PART I

Peter R. Thornton, Q.C.,	... Of the Honourable Society of the Middle Temple; Barrister-at-Law; Admitted to practise at the Bar of the United Kingdom on the 17th day of July, 1969.

PART II

Peter R. Thornton, Q.C., is eligible to be admitted to practise law as an Attorney only in relation to the following cause and any matter suit or other proceeding arising out of or in connection therewith namely Indictment No. 47 of 1995: The State v. Dole Chadee otherwise called Nankissoon Boodram; Joey Ramiah; Ramkalawan Singh otherwise called Lolly; Clive Thomas otherwise called Chiney; Robin Gopaul otherwise called Coupe; Russel Sankarali otherwise called Saroo; Levi Modeste; Joel Ramsingh otherwise called Joel; Stephen Eversley otherwise called Brain; Bhagwandeem Singh otherwise called Rambo.
