MADE BY THE MINISTER OF LEGAL AFFAIRS AFTER CONSULTATION WITH THE CHIEF JUSTICE UNDER SECTION 15A OF THE LEGAL PROFESSION ACT

THE LEGAL PROFESSION (ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION) (NO. 4) ORDER, 1996

1. This Order may be cited as the Legal Profession (Eligibility for Admission) (No. 4) Order, 1996.

2. The person referred to in Part I of the Schedule being a citizen of the United Kingdom qualified to practise law in the United Kingdom for not less than ten years, is eligible to be admitted to practise law in Trinidad and Tobago subject to the terms and conditions specified in Part II of the Schedule:

PART I

Alan Newman, q.c. Of the Honourable Society of the Middle Temple; Barrister-at-Law; Admitted to practise at the Bar of the United Kingdom on the 26th day of November, 1968.

PART II

Alan Newman, q.c., is eligible to be admitted to practise law as an Attorney only in relation to the following cause and any matter, suit or other proceeding arising out of or in connection therewith namely, the matter of the Extradition of Zimmern Beharry.
