THE NATIONAL DAY OF REMEMBRANCE (TEMPORARY
PROVISIONS) ORDER, 1996

1. This Order may be cited as the National Day of Remembrance ^{Citation}
(Temporary Provisions) Order, 1996.
2. This Order has effect from 7.00 a.m. to 12.00 noon on Sunday, ^{Duration}
10th November, 1996.
3. Subject to paragraph 4, parking is prohibited on— Parking
prohibited
 - (a) Queen's Park West, between Queen's Park East and
Frederick Street;
 - (b) Queen's Park East;
 - (c) Keate Street, between Charlotte Street and Chancery
Lane;
 - (d) Gordon Street, between Charlotte Street and Richmond
Street;
 - (e) Frederick Street, between Gordon Street and Queen's Park
West;
 - (f) Abercromby Street, between Gordon Street and Keate
Street;
 - (g) Pembroke Street, between Keate Street and Gordon
Street;
 - (h) New Street, between Pembroke Street and Charlotte
Street; and
 - (i) Chancery Lane.
4. (1) Parking is permitted on— Parking
restricted
 - (a) Frederick Street, between the western entrance to the
Memorial Park and Keate Street for—
 - (i) His Excellency, the President of the Republic of
Trinidad and Tobago;
 - (ii) the Honourable the Prime Minister of the Republic
of Trinidad and Tobago;

- (iii) The Honourable the Chief Justice of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago;
 - (iv) the President of the Senate;
 - (v) the Speaker of the House;
 - (vi) heads of religious denominations who are participating in the ceremony at the Cenotaph;
 - (b) Keate Street, between Frederick Street and Abercromby Street for Government Ministers;
 - (c) Keate Street, between Abercromby Street and Chancery Lane for members of the Diplomatic and Consular Corps;
 - (d) Pembroke Street, between Gordon Street and Keate Street for members of the Diplomatic and Consular Corps;
 - (e) Duprey Drive for—
 - (i) the Mayor of Port-of-Spain;
 - (ii) the Mayor of San Fernando;
 - (iii) the Mayor of Arima;
 - (iv) the Mayor of Point Fortin;
 - (v) the Mayor of Chaguanas;
 - (vi) the Commissioner of Police;
 - (vii) the Commanding Officer of the Trinidad and Tobago Regiment;
 - (viii) the Chief of Defence Staff;
 - (ix) the Commanding Officer of the Trinidad and Tobago Coast Guard;
 - (x) the Officer commanding the Parade;
 - (xi) the Chief Fire Officer;
 - (xii) the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of National Security; and
 - (f) on the Queen's Park Savannah opposite the Princes Building Grounds for other persons, in accordance with the directions of the police officers on duty.
- (2) Vehicles used by persons referred to in subparagraphs (1)(b), (c) and (d) shall bear the appropriate windscreen stickers.

Roads closed

5. The roads listed below are closed to vehicular traffic during the hours stated:

- (a) Frederick Street, between Queen's Park West and Keate Street, from 9.00 a.m. to 12.00 noon;
- (b) Queen's Park West, between Queen's Park East and Frederick Street, from 10.30 a.m. to 12.00 noon;
- (c) Queen's Park East, from 10.30 a.m. to 12.00 noon;

- (d) Charlotte Street, between Queen's Park West and Gordon Street, from 9.00 a.m. to 12.00 noon;
- (e) Keate Street, between Charlotte Street and Pembroke Street, from 9.00 a.m. to 12.00 noon; and
- (f) Pembroke Street, between Gordon Street and Keate Street, from 9.00 a.m. to 12.00 noon.

6. From 9.00 a.m. to 12.00 noon motorists proceeding—

Traffic
diverted

- (a) south on Queen's Park East shall turn east into Jerningham Avenue;
- (b) west on Jerningham Avenue, between Belmont Circular Road and Norfolk Street, shall turn east or west into Norfolk Street;
- (c) south on Archer Street shall turn east into Jerningham Avenue;
- (d) north on Charlotte Street shall turn west into Gordon Street;
- (e) north on Henry Street shall turn east into New Street.

7. From 9.00 a.m. to 12.00 noon motorists on Jerningham Avenue, between Queen's Park East and Archer Street, shall proceed in an easterly direction only.

One-way
traffic

8. During the observance of two minutes of silence from 11.00 a.m. to 11.02 a.m. police officers on duty shall bring to a standstill all vehicular traffic within the area bounded on the North by Queen's Park West, on the South by Gordon Street, on the East partly by Queen's Park East and partly by Charlotte Street and on the West by Chancery Lane.

9. Without prejudice to any other liability incurred by the commission of a summary offence, vehicles found parked in contravention of this Order may be removed by the Police and impounded and dealt with in accordance with section 108(1)(b) of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Act.
